

## Planning Sheet: Apps for Multiple Intelligences

**Musical Learners:** good at thinking in patterns rhythms or sounds



Bloom: tap the screen to create patterns and melodies



Garage band: includes touch instruments and a recording studio

**Visual/Spatial Learners:** think in terms of visual space and are very aware of their environments



iMovie: a fast and fun movie making app



Pow: create comic strips using templates your own pictures and drawings.

**Verbal/Linguistic Learners:** use words effectively and like making up poems or stories



Story Kit: write your own story and add pictures and even your own voice or sound effects



Puppet Pals: use onboard puppets or your own picture and voice to tell a story

**Naturalistic Learner:** observant and attentive; notice patterns around them and in the environment



Project Noah: take and share pictures of plants and wildlife to document and share with others



Star Walk: helps you identify the stars and constellations in the night sky as you are stargazing

**Logical/Mathematical Learner:** good at reasoning, calculating, seeing patterns; need to learn concepts before dealing with details.



Popplet: an interactive white board used to take notes, explore ideas, brainstorm and collaborate; create galleries and presentations



Fantastic Contraption: build a machine with simple tools to move an object toward a goal

**Intrapersonal Learner:** understand their own interests and goals; tend to shy away from others; good at working independently



Remember the Milk: great note taking and organizational tool



Kidspiration: mind mapping tool that lets you organize your thoughts, ideas and information

**Interpersonal Learner:** learn through interaction and group activities



Skype: video conference and connect and collaborate with anyone in the world who also has access to skype.



Air sketch Free: described as a visual thinking tool it can connect with any other device and share with any other device on your network

**Bodily/Kinesthetic:** communicate well through their body and can be taught best through hands on learning and role playing



Storyrobe: create digital stories with pictures and narration to share over the internet; can be combined with the stories of others to create storythreads.



Doodle Buddy: use your fingers to write, draw and make sounds to save or share with others on social media or as text messages
